# **Sermon Summary**

In case you missed it, or if you just need a refresher, here's a quick summary of what we talked about this week in the sermon:

In today's sermon titled "The Thud of Falling Stones" based on John 8:1-11, Pastor discussed how Jesus interacted with a woman caught in adultery, contrasting His approach with that of the religious leaders. While the leaders sought to exploit and condemn her for their own agenda, Jesus showed compassion and offered her grace and a second chance. The sermon emphasized the importance of focusing on people rather than agendas, not being quick to condemn, and the transformative power of Jesus' forgiveness.

### **Conversation Starters**

These are things you can talk about with your kids to help further the conversation about what they may have learned on Sunday.

#### Over Dinner

- Question: "Why do you think the religious leaders were so focused on condemning the woman?"
- Context: Discuss how the leaders were using the woman to trap Jesus, reflecting on their true motives.

#### During a Car Ride

- Question: "How did Jesus show kindness to the woman caught in adultery?"
- Context: Talk about how Jesus took attention away from the woman and gave her a second chance.

#### At Bedtime

- Question: "What can we learn from Jesus' response to the woman's sin?"
- Context: Reflect on the importance of offering grace and not condemning others.

#### While Doing Chores

- Question: "Why do you think Jesus wrote in the dust before answering the accusers?"
- Context: Explore the theories about what Jesus might have been doing and how it shifted focus from the woman.

#### On a Walk

- Question: "How can we show grace like Jesus did in our daily lives?"
- Context: Discuss practical ways to extend forgiveness and second chances to others around us.
