

This guide is meant to equip you with discussion questions and conversation starters that you can use throughout the week to continue the conversation about what you and your kids learned on Sunday.

Sermon Summary

In case you missed it, or if you just need a refresher, here's a quick summary of what we talked about this week in the sermon:

This week's sermon focused on the concept of legacy and heritage, particularly in the context of faith. The speaker reflected on Memorial Day, remembering those who gave their lives for freedom, and pondered the spiritual legacy left by previous generations. Key Biblical passages were cited, including Deuteronomy 6 and Mark 12, emphasizing the importance of loving God and passing on faith to the next generation. The sermon concluded with a call to consider our own legacy, encouraging a life lived with eternal values in mind, and raising the next generation to know and honor God.

Conversation Starters

These are things you can talk about with your kids to help further the conversation about what they may have learned on Sunday.

- Talking about Memorial Day:
 - Why do we honor people on Memorial Day, and how does their sacrifice relate to our freedom?
 - Reference to the sermon's opening where Memorial Day is described as a day to honor those who made the ultimate sacrifice for freedom.
- Discussing Legacy:
 - What kind of legacy would you like to leave behind? Why is that important?
 - The sermon asks listeners to consider what legacy they will leave, especially in terms of faith and values.
- Heritage and Family Roots:
 - Can you tell me something about our family's history or where we come from?

- Speaker shares discoveries about his family roots during the visit to Ellis Island and the importance of heritage.
- Faith and Family:
 - What does it mean to have a faith heritage, and why is it significant for us?
 - How can we as a family help each other pass the baton of faith to the next generation?
- Training and Directing Children:
 - How can we, as a family, 'direct' our paths to reflect our love for God?
 - Based on the principle in Proverbs 22:6 about directing children along the right path, as mentioned in the sermon.
